A Year of Firsts... Wellness Reimagined

There was a big focus on wellness and staying active in 2022!

Creating Alternatives collaborated with Bayshore Healthcare to introduce group exercises developed with specific therapeutic goals within the day program setting which was led by a kinesiologist during the summer months. Individuals were given the opportunity to collaborate with friends and get active in a fun and productive way!

For those individuals needing further interventions to improve mobility, safety, balance and to work on gaining confidence, they were paired with a physiotherapist for individualized sessions in-home.



Independent Living Program Lou Fruitman Reena Residence

Providing individuals with the tools and experience to learn valuable life skills, or fostering skills already possessed can be a vital next step for family members' journey to independent living. The new Independent Living program held at the Lou Fruitman Reena Residence in Thornhill is an all-encompassing program focusing on functional life skills. Individuals have the opportunity of learning, practicing, or refining their life skills such as cooking, kitchen safety, household cleaning, building relationships with "roommates", engaging in their community, and money skills with the goal of increasing independent living.

A partnership with Cisco has designated this site as a Proof of Concept site for the Autonomous Living project whereby technology is leveraged to assist individuals of diverse abilities to perform their daily tasks with reduced assistance. The site is retrofitted with sensors and will rely on smart notifications and smart device integration to promote independence.









Supporting Our Caregivers



A support group was established for caregivers with funding assistance from the New Horizons for Seniors grant.

This initiative, led by its members, was started to provide a support system for caregivers, to provide peer socialization and to provide and exchange knowledge. The group enjoyed social activities such as pizza and wine night, an Argos game, a Niagara winery visit, in addition to knowledge-based events with guest speakers.

The resounding response from this initiative was positive, with existing and new families forming meaningful relationships, gaining knowledge and connecting with like-minded peers.

"H'Art" Anyone?

Creating Alternatives was part of an exciting initiative hosted by H'art Centre in partnership with the Marine Museum of the Great Lakes at Kingston in celebration of the 50th anniversary of the Great Lakes Water Quality Agreement.

Creating Alternatives was 1 of 10 organizations chosen from across Canada by the H'art Centre Inclusive Arts for All Abilities based in Kingston, Ontario to take part in their Connecting Canadians: Freshwater initiative. This project supported visual arts outreach to exhibit art pieces from various Canadian organizations.

Creating Alternatives had the opportunity of sending in 4 art pieces from our very own participants for the exhibit at the museum and priced for sale with a portion of the proceeds going to the artist.

Increasing Site Accessibility

Creating Alternatives is grateful to have received a federal grant to renovate two of its washrooms to increase accessibility and inclusivity.

Both washrooms have been designated and updated as gender-neutral with appropriate signage and increased privacy. The washrooms are equipped with handsfree equipment, grab bars, an alert bell and light, a motorized door operator, added space to enable safe transfers and staff assistance. An accessible shower facility was also added which will support personal care needs.

The renovations have been long overdue and are welcomed!




This past year, the Italian Car Day (ICD) event has chosen Creating Alternatives as the beneficiary charity.



The event kicked off the Capital Campaign for Creating Alternatives with silent and live auctions.


